- 2. **Objective of the Practice**:

 - Reduction of overall COVID-19 severity and mortality;

3. The Context:

The first case of COVID-19 infection reported in Kerala, India on January 27, 2020. During Covid-19 Pandemic that was first wave. India began its vaccination programme on **16 January 2021.** Nandurbar District in Maharashtra saw an exponential rise in cases in the second wave. Nandurbar District has reported a worrisome 1200 infection daily in early April 2021. One reason behind this situation is not awareness about Covid-19 Vaccination.

4. The Practice:

A questionnaire was prepared using Google Forms for collecting vaccination information of students and the link of this form was shared to all students. According to the information received from the students, a total of 57 students had received the second dose of vaccination and 44 students had received the first vaccination. 19 students had no vaccination and rest 30 students did not provide information. The college collected the vaccination information of such students with a concerted effort and it was unanimously decided to vaccinate the students in the college itself.

5. Evidence of Success

Vaccination camp organizes by college on 25/10/2021 and 28/10/2021. A total of 30 students were vaccinated in this vaccination campaign.
